Adam Art Gallery Te Pātaka Toi is pleased to be seeking a new intern to join its team in 2019.

Adam Art Gallery Director Christina Barton says “After our successful internship programme this year we are eager to work again with someone starting out in their career in the art world.

“Lachlan Taylor, our inaugural intern, was a real asset, helping us deliver several exhibitions and working towards an exhibition that will be realised in 2019. We are especially pleased to report that Lachlan will be moving to Auckland to take up the Assistant Curator position at Artspace. I am confident that his experience at the Adam helped him take this next step.”

The Adam Art Gallery Internship has been made possible through a generous donation from local philanthropist Barbara Blake. It is a part-time paid internship that will enable a recent graduate, postgraduate or early-career art professional to work with the Gallery to develop hands-on knowledge of curatorial practice and exhibition-making.

The intern will work alongside the team in the Adam Art Gallery office at Victoria University of Wellington’s Kelburn campus, with opportunities to undertake self-directed research as well as contribute to the Gallery’s activities.

On his experience as the Adam Art Gallery intern, Lachlan says:

“The internship allowed me to work across all levels of a high-functioning public gallery with an incredible team. The experience I’ve gained at every stage of an exhibition, from research to public programming, is the perfect foundation from which I hope to build my career in the arts sector. The value of being an Adam Art Gallery intern will be long term, with the intern becoming part of a cohort acknowledged on the Gallery's website and connected over time with other alumni. Their work at the Gallery will be acknowledged and remembered and can be used for future career development.
